



"Thou shalt not flush the dog's head down the toilet while he's getting a drink. The Bible never said that!" Dear Friends,

As I had the tele on, on the recent snowy Sunday morning, to check the weather over the M62, I heard an interview with Nigel Farage, who was defending Elon Musk's very accusatory and inflammatory tweets against the Prime minister. (If we can still call messages on X "Tweets")

His argument was that he was in favour of unrestricted free speech, he should be free to say whatever he wants, and his hearers are free to take offence or not, as they wish. If we censored anything at which someone somewhere might take offence, then we would have an Orwellian society with the Thought Police censoring everything.

Of course his line of argument follows the usual fallacy of "one extreme or the other" rather than a line somewhere between the two, but I wonder if there might be more to the question for Christians beyond where to draw the line. What freedoms must we claim, and what can we use our freedom for, and what must we not use it for?

On the one hand we want the freedom to tell about Jesus, even if some do take offence even at the mention of his name, and much persecution has centred on preventing the gospel being shared. At times in history Christians have felt compelled to stand firm in their faith against authorities who tell them to deny our Lord, or to remain silent, and that is a clear exception to Paul's instructions to honour earthly authorities.

How should we use our freedom, and what should we not do with it?

Peter's instruction in 1 Peter 3:15 & 16 is informative: "Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect keeping a clear conscience, so that those who speak maliciously against your good behaviour in Christ may be ashamed of their slander".

Gentleness and Respect, not anger, aggression, belittling their beliefs, sarcasm etc. The prayer "O Lord, may my words today be tender and sweet, for tomorrow I may have to eat them," reminds us to be humble, and gentle whilst speaking the truth in love.

So even where we have complete uncensored unfettered freedom such as Nigel Farage speaks about (Ironically that freedom is one of the first things to disappear when an extremist government, right or left gets into in power) we cannot use it to cause gratuitous offence, engage in slander, or distort fact with exaggeration.

A few excerpts from the letter to James, chapter 3, give us further cautions: Indeed, it's worth reading the whole chapter in one go......

- 2: "We all stumble in many ways. Anyone who is never at fault in what they say is perfect, able to keep their whole body in check".
- 9-12: "With the tongue we praise our Lord and Father, and with it we curse human beings, who have been made in God's likeness. ¹⁰ Out of the same mouth come praise and cursing. My brothers and sisters, this should not be. ¹¹ Can both fresh water and salt water flow from the same spring? ¹² My brothers and sisters, can a fig tree bear olives, or a grapevine bear figs? Neither can a salt spring produce fresh water."
- 17-18: "But the wisdom that comes from heaven is first of all pure; then peace-loving, considerate, submissive, full of mercy and good fruit, impartial and sincere. ¹⁸ Peacemakers who sow in peace reap a harvest of righteousness".

If our words are filled with truth and light, then they will highlight good, but will be disturbing to those who prefer darkness.

May the Lord place a guard on our tongues, to use them for his glory, and not for harm Love in our Lord
